# **Landfill Operation - Waste Disposal**

## **Key Facts and Figures**

- Established on April 24, 2012 under the Ministry of Regional Development and Infrastructure
- The government holds 100 % shares of the company
- Since 2013, the company owns and operates 53 former municipal landfills out of which 28 have been rehabilitated and 14 have been closed
- The company has a total of 272 staff (68 in the head office Tbilisi and 204 in regional offices)
- The company is reponsible for solid waste management with respect to landfills in Georgia, excluding the city of Tbiliisi and the Adjara region
- The company is going to construct up to 7 new regional landfills.

We construct new landfills





We have actually several projects running for constructing new landfills compliant with EU standard: 1) Imereti and Racha-Lechkhumi and Kvemo Svaneti; 2) Kvemo Kartli; 3) Kakheti and Samegrelo (stage of feasability study).

We rehabilitate landfills





28 out of 53 landfills have been rehabilitated and 14 have been closed in a regulate way. The rehabilitated landfills assure controlled waste disposal until a complete network of modern EU standard regional landfill has been built and is operational.

### Our achievements since 2013

We operate landfills





The 215 regional staff of our company are operating the 53 landfills. They assure daily coverage of waste with soil, keep the landfill and surrounding area clean and communicate regularly waste guantities received to the central office in Tbilisi.

Our mission is to manage the transition from an unregulated system of solid waste disposal towards a fully integrated waste management system in compliance with European standards.
